#### LICENCING REQUIREMENTS FOR FINCH KEEPING in WESTERN AUSTRALIA

This article summarises the licencing requirements with respect to the keeping of finches by private aviculturists in Western Australia (WA) as at June 2021. Note that while the licences discussed below also cover the keeping of other bird species, only finches are considered here.

The keeping of native Australian finches in WA is managed within the WA Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA). The keeping of introduced (exotic) finches is separately regulated by the WA Department of Primary industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) but licencing is managed within DBCA on behalf of DPIRD. Most finches kept by private aviculturists in WA are classified for licencing purposes into one of the following five groups described below. To check which group your finch is in, refer to the Finch Category Tables below. For a complete list of all bird species, refer to the downloadable document *Pet keeping and dealing list.pdf* for native (Australian) birds and *Restricted bird permit application.pdf* for introduced (exotic) birds.

#### **GROUP 1:** Native (Australian) Finches Category A (species listed in Table 1 below)

Exempt, no licence required. No annual return required.

## GROUP 2: Native (Australian) Finches Category B (species listed in Table 2 below)

Fauna Possessing (Pet Keepers) Licence (Standard) required.

To apply for this licence, use the downloadable form *Fauna possessing (pet keeper's) licence.pdf*. This licence is issued for a term of 1 or 3 years. A return listing the numbers of Category B species on hand is due at the end of the licence term. Use the downloadable form *Category B Bird Keeping Return.pdf*.

#### **GROUP 3:** Native (Australian) Finches Category C (species listed in Table 3 below)

Fauna Possessing (Pet Keepers) Licence (Advanced) required. This licence enables the holder to keep Category B and Category C finches.

To apply for this licence, use the downloadable form *Fauna possessing (pet keeper's) licence.pdf*. This licence is issued for a term of 1 or 3 years. A return listing the numbers of Category B species on hand is due at the end of the licence term. Use the downloadable form *Category B Bird Keeping Return.pdf*.

A return is required EVERY year regardless of the licence term for Category C finches ONLY.

For each Category C species the following information is required on the return:

- date of acquisition or disposal.

- method of acquisition or disposal (eg purchased, sold, bred, sold, escaped, died).
- licence number of the supplier or recipient in the case of purchases and sales.

Use the downloadable form Annual Pet Keeping Return.pdf.

#### **GROUP 4: Exempt Introduced (Exotic) Finches (species listed in Table 4 below)**

No licence required.

No annual return required.

#### **GROUP 5: Restricted Introduced (Exotic) Finches (species listed in Table 5 below)**

Restricted Bird Permit required.

To apply for this licence, use the downloadable form *Restricted bird permit application.pdf*. This licence is issued for a term of 1 or 3 years. A return listing the numbers of Restricted Species on hand is due at the end of the licence term. These may be listed on the licence application form.

## FINCH CATEGORY TABLES

Native (Australian) finches are classified into three categories (Category A, listed in Table 1, Category B, listed in Table 2 or Category C, listed in Table 3).

Introduced (Exotic) finches are classified into two categories (Exempt, listed in Table 4 or Restricted, listed in Table 5).
